The Roval British Legion have sent details of this years Remembrance Parade and Service. The service will be held at the Grylls Monument, at the bottom of Coinagehall Street - in Helston town centre, on Sunday 13th November.

If you wish to be part of the Parade on Sunday 13th, please be at the Trengrouse Way Extension Car Park, no later than 10:15 (Please note road closures throughout the town will be in place from 1000). The Parade Master will coordinate Standard Bearers and form up the rest of the Parade, ready to step off at approximately 1030. The Parade will then make its way to the Grylls Monument - where the Service will commence. Mrs Reynolds and Mrs Luff will be taking part in the parade, so look out for them in the Trengrouse Way car park.

If your child wishes to take part in the parade, could we kindly ask that they wear their school uniform and a poppy, so they can be clearly identified as representing St Michael's School.

The school have also been invited to attend this years Armistice Day Service, on Friday 11th November. Mrs Martin, along with some of our Year 6 students, will be attending the service on this day to represent St Michael's School.

What are we looking for?

Our school 'School Monitoring Council' is made up of Councillors from all walks of life and many come to us through a variety of routes and with a range of different backgrounds, skills and experiences, but they are all volunteers who work together for the benefit of the school and are the link between the school and the community it serves.

We want you

We are currently looking for new Parent Councillors and would be delighted to hear from anyone who has:

- An interest in the performance of the school
- A desire to contribute to and represent the community
- An open and enquiring mind
- The ability to look at issues objectively
- The confidence to ask questions and join in debate
- A willingness to listen and make informed judgements
- The ability to work well with others
- Time to spare
- A child or children currently attending the school

If you match the above description, you may be the very person to become a Parent Councillor at **St Michael's School.**

Everyone has something to offer, and we want people from as many backgrounds and with as wide a range of interests as possible.

What can we offer?

- The opportunity to work with our school councillor monitoring team and staff in improving our school
- A sense of achievement in making a difference to our school
- The pleasure of helping students reach their potential

What is the School Monitoring Council's role?

The function of the SMCs is to contribute to school improvement by holding to account the Heads of School for their effectiveness in addressing agreed improvement priorities. They will also help to ensure robust governance across the Trust by engaging with the Hub Councils and, thereby, the Board of Directors.

Each SMC has a key role to play in the overall success of the MAT and in contributing to joint working and sharing best practice between its academies.

A parent councillor is not a delegate and does not speak 'on behalf' of the parent body. The role and responsibilities of parent councillors are no different from those of the other councillors.

The SMC meets three times a year, the meetings are held in the evening and run for approximately 2 hours. The term of office is 4 years.

As well as attending meetings councillors are also asked to look at specific areas of the school's work in more detail and report back to the SMC.

To help support councillors, everyone has access to further training to help build on existing skills or to develop new ones.

Depending on the number of applications there may be an election process, which will be advised in due course.
