



The Parent Forum was established to discuss the school's progress with regard to the key issues arising from the Ofsted inspection in March 2012. They are to:

- ❖ Improve the quality of teaching to ensure pupils meet expected levels of achievement for their age.
- ❖ Improve the quality of the curriculum in Key Stage 2.
- ❖ Strengthen leadership and management at all levels

The H.M.I inspection in July 2013 was the fourth monitoring inspection since the school became subject to Special Measures. The overall findings were:

- ❖ Progress since being subject to special measures – good.
- ❖ Progress since previous monitoring inspection – good.

Teaching continues to improve, and this is reflected in the outcomes and progress of pupils. The school's monitoring by senior and subject leaders shows focused support for individual teachers has been effective, and this was apparent in the quality of teaching observed during the monitoring inspection

The school has appointed Mr Glover as our Pupil Premium Manager. Part of Mr Glover's role is liaising with parents with regard to issues that do not necessarily need to involve Mr. Perfect. In addition, he is the contact for Service families. Mr Glover also leads the Pupil Premium team which includes Mrs. Reynolds and Mrs. Woods. Their aim is to identify and work with children that we think would benefit from a little extra help in school, whether this is in the form of assistance with their school work, support with anything that may be troubling them or to provide a person who they know they can turn to if they need to talk. It is envisaged that the team will provide additional opportunities for all the children within the targeted groups during the school year though some will have more contact with them than others. Our role is to help the children be happy, confident and successful learners
